## Worth a Drive: Photographic exhibition by Andy Summers of The Police

The Police, along with 78,000 eager fans, will invade Fenway Park on July 28 and 29 for two sold out concerts in celebration of the band's long awaited 30th anniversary and worldwide reunion tour.

Surrounding these appearances, Newbury Fine Arts is offering the public a glimpse into the lives of these international rock stars during their touring heyday.

In the early 1980s, The Police went on tour accompanied by a photographer who documented the band behind the scenes in a series of candid and striking black and white photos.

Somewhere between photojournalism and an illustrated diary, the exhibit follows The Police around the globe between 1980 and 1983.

The art show features 38 black and white photographs, which have been individually hand signed and numbered. The edition size is limited.

The exhibit runs from July 21 through Aug. 10 at Newbury Fine Arts, 29 Newbury St., Boston, Mass.

Gallery hours are Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Sunday from noon to 5 p.m.

A public art sale and party take place on Thursday, July 26, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.
